Dispensations And Covenants

**I. Course Description:**

This course will be an overview of the various covenants that God has made with mankind and with Himself. The biblical background leading up to each covenant will be thoroughly explored and the relevance of each covenant to New Testament believers will be examined. The Dispensations will be identified and explored to determine the historical purpose as well as the threads of commonality that run between them. The correlation between the covenants and dispensations, if any, will be examined.

**II. Course Objectives:**

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- A. Identify and explain each of the covenants that God has made with man and Himself.
- B. Identify and explain each of the dispensations that have prevailed throughout the relationship between God and man.
- C. Prepare their personal Bibles with notes and outlines designed to highlight the important features of these two schools of thoughts so as to make identifying and recognizing them in scripture more natural.
- D. Effectively use these truths and those relating to them to preach and teach them while rightly dividing the Word of God.
- E. Understand the meanings of specific terminology used by those who have taken an erroneous position on both of these schools of thought.

**III. Course Requirements:**

- A. The student is required to memorize important, relevant verses to defend Biblical truth.
- B. The student is required to maintain a course notebook, including all: lecture notes, handouts, quizzes, tests, and course projects. Notebooks are due at the end of the semester.
- C. The Student is required to complete a course project by *December 10, 2013*.
